### **Welcome and Introductions:**

The meeting began with exhibits displayed by McLane students and teachers to provide an overview and description of CTE offered at McLane High School. CTE Committee members and guests spoke with students, viewed student's work, and asked questions. Mike Schwan, CTE Advisory Chair, called the meeting to order at 3:50pm and welcomed all the Board Members and guests in attendance. He thanked the teachers and students for being there today. All Committee members and guests briefly introduced themselves. Mike introduced Interim Superintendent, Bob Nelson who thanked all for attending and supporting CTE in our District as we kick off the 17/18 school year. Interim Superintendent Nelson discussed people's confusion about CTE and the need for a deeper communication. He talked about the Summit in May, a collaborative effort to gather information and feedback to improve CTE work. Our families want to know what's available. Interim Superintendent Nelson described the partnership with the city to get transportation so kids can go wherever there is a pathway they are interested in. To build awareness of what is available to all students, College and Career Readiness is holding a CTE event Nov. 8th for all 8th graders. Interim Superintendent Nelson talked about the new partnership with CHSU and is grateful for the support in building CTE in our Valley from Chief Jerry Dyer and Mayor Lee Brand. In terms of the growth in Fresno Unified and CTE, Interim Superintendent Nelson shared that the School board invested 18.7 million to continue and expand CTE. Duncan is bringing in heavy truck repair as well. He closed by sharing his goal for all students to have an internship and thanked all in attendance for their time and lifting our city to make it better.

### **Minutes/Co-Chair Approval:**

Mike Schwan asked committee to review minutes from previous meeting on 4/27/17. Motion to approve minutes was moved by Nuvia Varela and Scott Lewis seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed.

### **Recognition for 16/17 Committee Members:**

Michelle Wong noted thanks and appreciation for the Advisory Committee and their continued support. She directed their attention to the gifts of appreciation on the tables and her wish for a productive and collaborative 17/18 school year.

### **Growth of CTE in the District:**

Kristen Boroski, Director of Career Readiness for Fresno Unified thanked all for being there and gave a special thank you to McLane students, teachers and administration for hosting today's meeting. Kristen provided an overview of the additional pathways, teachers, counselors and CTE Coordinators in Fresno Unified. Kristen discussed the Building Futures newsletter, which each member had in their folder. She described that this edition specifically focused on CTE and the progress and growth in the District. She reminded all about the CTE- Ticket to the Future event in November, which would be an opportunity for all 8th grade students (approximately 6000) to see programs, pathways, and courses related to CTE in an effort to build awareness of all that is available to students as they make decisions for high school. Kristen also shared about the Student Voice/Rapid Innovation project that took place over the summer. This was a collaborative workshop in which students from all high schools worked together in an effort to problem solve from a student's perspective.

Kristen again thanked our industry partners for their support this past school year. She specifically thanked Mike Schwan for his leadership as CTE Advisory Chair and for his continued support and advocacy for CTE.

### **Work-Based Learning Report:**

Julia Reese provided an overview of the elementary experiences from this summer. Students in grades 3rd-5th were exposed to industry sectors including Education, Child Development, Engineering and Design, Health Science and Medical Technology.

Jeff DeLong provided a breakdown of all Work Based Learning events and experiences and the tremendous growth (600% increase). He discussed several experiences that took place over the summer including the Sports Science Institute, the Teacher Academy, RSD Total Control, USDA and PG&E Summer Internships, and the Doctors Academy Job Shadow. He emphasized that this does not happen without industry and thanked the committee for their support and involvement. Jeff shared with the committee the goal to expand Work Based Learning this school year, and reminded all of Job Shadow Day happening February 2nd, 2018.

Tara Loll discussed the Professional Learning that took place this summer for our teachers. This included Project Design Week and Teacher Externships. Both of these experiences provided industry knowledge and skills to Fresno Unified teachers.

### **WBL Platform/E3 Network:**

Jon Bradford from IMAGO shared the history of E3 and the exciting partnership with Fresno Unified. This platform is an opportunity to provide easy access to Work Based Learning from the perspective of a student, a teacher, and an industry partner. ### **Industry Announcements and Public Comment:**

Sam Geil shared this summer group went to Chicago for the Dream it, Do it conference, FCOE and FUSD both participating as well as other valley districts. IGIHOF: International Green Industry Hall of Fame founded by him about 10 years ago to spotlight green industries. This year, the conference would take place at Clovis Veterans memorial to highlight vets in green industry. New this year: a student environmental leadership conference free for Juniors and Seniors and teachers interested in green industry. Sam invited all to be his guest for the 6th also. He shared the original vision behind IGIHOF was to try and create a green industry center in Fresno area.

Nuvia Varela from Workforce Connection shared apprenticeship partnership with SJVMA –San Joaquin Valley Manufacturing Alliance and Reedley College, and reported the graduation for the first cohort of students. She shared that 2 Duncan students finished with certificates in machinists and welding last summer. They now make \$16 an hour with full benefits and are still continuing on with their education. New cohort this summer coming. Refer your students- the process is as follows: industry interviews them, workforce provides summer internships and they enroll at Reedley College or FCC –all paid through Workforce Connection.

Mary Willis- Internship Coordinator for Jordan College of Agricultural Sciences and Technology, reported on hosting internships as part of USDA program this summer. The Jordan Center of Agriculture hosted 16 students ages 14-17 in a two-week intensive exposure to all things food and agriculture. Students had the opportunity to live on campus- all expenses paid except initial transportation. Dr. Castro was excited to offer a yearly scholarship for students who had participated in the program. Hoping for more students who apply and participate. Applications coming out on September 18th and due in early March. Ages this summer will be 15-17 because 14 seemed too young.

Charles Douglas of CHSU reported on starting an evening class in entrepreneurship and digital health. Hope to offer it again next year. Also in planning stages collaborating with 59 Days of Code- digital health.

Mike Schwan shared experience with an intern this summer at RSD Total Control. Got more confident after weeks in, from start of not speaking hardly at all. By last day with his parents there- the student became more talkative. He talked about his senior year- wanted to do mechanical engineering at Cal Poly. Amazing what kids do- smart guy on the job. Going to keep pushing down the road of internship more and more- trying to make it easier for employers to participate in that. Keep getting word out that good things are happening in this district. Thank you!

Mike once again thanked McLane staff and faculty for hosting the event. Motion to adjourn meeting at 4:57 was made and seconded with unanimous approval.

##### Welcome and Introductions:

The meeting began with exhibits displayed by Edison High School students and teachers to provide an overview and description of CTE offered at Edison High School. CTE Committee members and guests spoke with students, viewed student's work, and asked questions.

Mike Schwan called the meeting to order at 3:52 pm and noted appreciation for the students presenting and principal Lindsay Sanders. New partners asked to stand and introduce themselves. Joseph Oldham from CalStart San Joaquin Valley Clean transportation center and Tom Yeaglin from Quinn Inc. introduced themselves. Sara Hamilton from City of Fresno Parks Youth Job Prep program introduced

herself. Keith Kamimoto from Future Ford Service Dept. introduced himself and shared he is currently working with Duncan. Mary Aguirre- Retired CTE teacher introduced herself. Mike noted that this is the 3rd of 4 meetings and the year is passing quickly. Superintendent Bob Nelson introduced himself and thanked everyone for being here. Mr. Nelson noted that CTE is moving quickly now thanks to everyone involved and spoke about the new heavy truck center at Duncan Polytechnic and the additional potential opportunities that would create. He thanked partners for supporting Measure X and spoke about its relation to the projects moving forward. Supt. Nelson spoke about the Job Shadow Day growth: On February 2nd, Job shadow day had 26 partners and 195 kids as opposed to 12/95 last year participating. He thanked the businesses that let students come into their space and work with them. Supt. Nelson also noted that Duncan had the second highest college going rate, speaking well to preparing students for College AND Careers.

### **Minutes/Co-Chair Approval:**

Mike Schwan asked committee to review minutes from previous meeting in November. Motion to approve minutes from November 30th, 2017 was made by Stephanie Robinson. Heather Marquez seconded the motion to approve the minutes. All in favor, none opposed.

### **College and Career Readiness Updated:**

Kristen Boroski shared some wins, gratitudes and asks for CCR. Success made possible by hard work of Sally Fowler who is CTE Administrator of the year for our area and going on to state level for potential recognition there. Educator excellence award happened just a few weeks ago. Laurie Wehner- Nursing services teacher at Duncan recognized as HS educator of the year. Industry partners being recognized too included: Mike Schwan receiving educator partner award from Fresno Compact and County Supt. Of Schools recognizing two industry partners for Noli Awards- CRMC and CMAC being recognized this Spring.

Kristen also updated everyone on Linked Learning Certification and reviewed brief history of the impacts and benefits ending with 25 current pathways. 477 Linked Learning pathways in the nation. 20 recognized as a silver level pathway and Fresno Unified had 4 of those. Criteria for recognition was included in the folder. Introduced representatives from those schools for recognition.

Kristen shared information about the Leadership Lessons and Social Emotional learning and Graduate Profile- alignment with intentional online lessons focused on Graduate Profile skills for students in all grade levels. She explained the rationale and format of these lessons and shared the work to build skills that business partners previously noted as necessary skill sets for career ready graduates.

Kristen provided an update on the CTE Facilities Grants. –She shared College and Career Readiness submitted 10 applications on behalf of CTE in Fresno Unified. All applications received 105+ points making them eligible for funding. Our highest score- without a rubric to work from, was 136. Submitting more paperwork now for each of those grants. Thank you to our industry and post-secondary partners for letters of support. Next round should be made available in March, and we will continue moving forward and applying for the next round of funding for the next group of schools /projects.

Kristen shared the date for the 2nd annual CTE summit coming up in April at Duncan Polytechnic High School. Superintendent and partners will give an update on work this past year. College and Career Readiness also has plans to include another CTE Ticket to the Future event- Event for 8th graders held this last year at Valdez Hall. Heard from last summit that more communication was needed for all district CTE programs so this was a solution/response to that feedback. Kristen invited all to attend and give more feedback and see what has been happening in the Fresno Unified CTE pathways, programs, and courses.

Jeff DeLong shared Work-Based Learning growth for the District. Job shadow day was major success and more than doubled participation from last year: 31 different locations hosted students and shared a day in the life for careers with plans to double it again next year. Jeff went over Opportunities for Involvement form and online link to share with additional partners. Mike challenged Committee members to become involved and participate in more events.

### **Subcommittee Share Out:**

#### **Mike Schwan (Industrial Manufacturing and Technology Sub-Committee)**

##### Welcome and Introductions:

The meeting began with exhibits displayed by Bullard High School students and teachers to provide an overview and description of CTE offered at Bullard High School. CTE Committee members and guests spoke with students, viewed student's work, and asked questions. Mike asked group to join in celebrating Heather's birthday.

Mike Schwan called the meeting to order at 3:48 pm and noted appreciation for the students presenting and Principal Carlos Castillo welcomed the committee to Bullard and shared some success on the Bullard campus.

### **Minutes/Co-Chair Approval:**

Mike Schwan asked committee to review minutes from meeting in November. Motion to approve minutes from February 22, 2018 was made by Xavier Martinez. Heather Marquez seconded the motion to approve the minutes. All in favor, none opposed.

### **By-Laws Review:**

Mike shared the By-Laws revisions and asked all to take a minute to review. Mike discussed the terms of membership stated in the By-Laws - rotating 1 and 2 year terms for 2018-19 School Year. Mike asked for a motion to approve By-laws. Motion to approve as written by Heather Marquez. Further discussion asked- none. Seconded by Florida Cheung. All in favor with none opposed- motion carried.

Mike asked for a follow up to his challenge to all committee members to get involved at campus events such as portfolio day, mock interviews. Mike mentioned critical need to keep growing with more participation all the way through. Keep inviting additional industry experts -especially to subcommittee meetings. Jon Bradford from IMAGO shared about participating in Duncan Senior Defense events. Tara reminded all that there are still several dates needing volunteers this school year, and shared dates on the back of the agenda. Also shared next year's committee meeting schedule. Mike asked Rochelle Cantu to share about career fair experiences, where she was involved. Rochelle shared about being at Sunnyside and students being professional and organized there. Today at Hoover, she also helped with portfolio review with about 10 kids. Rochelle enjoys being involved. She shared that next month Paul Mitchell students would be assisting with the Roosevelt Fashion Show doing hair and make-up for RHS fashion models. This would be her fourth year assisting with this and she described it as a great experience and invited all to join. Mike noted the need for more volunteers assisting and supporting, especially on portfolio days. Come away impressed and invite friends to join and attend.

### **College and Career Readiness Update:**

Kristen Boroski shared some of the happenings in CCR Fresno Unified. First handout was regarding the Graduate Profile. Skills and competencies that business partners ask for from students when seeking employees are all key components of the Graduate Profile. Kristen reviewed some key components of these critical skills and also shared that Social Emotional Learning is vital and Fresno USD has invested in this heavily. This is new work in collaboration with Department of Prevention and Intervention to combine these skills to work together now.

Kristen also shared the growth in pathway certification for the District. Currently in year 4 of pathways and proud of coordinators' leadership.

Day of Advocacy was discussed. This event took place in March. Twenty-five students from our six healthcare pathway high schools advocated for issues around health in our community before Assemblyman Joaquin Arambula, as well as staff from Assemblyman Patterson's office, Community Regional Medical Center, Kaiser Permanente, and St. Agnes Medical Center.

CTE Summit- last week Fresno Unified had second annual event hosted at Duncan Polytechnical High School. Supt. Bob Nelson, Fresno City College and Clovis Community presidents presented on opportunities offered around Career Technical Education and Dual Enrollment. Parents, students, industry and post-secondary partners had the chance to tour Duncan and see student demonstrations in

their labs and classrooms. Table groups discussed challenges and ideas to improve and promote opportunities in CTE. Communication rose to the top as an area to continually address in our system. Some tables noted Ticket to the Future- an event held last fall for all 8th grade students. One student mentioned that's where he learned about a pathway at Duncan he wanted to attend. We listened to previous feedback to create that event. Fresno Unified will plan another Ticket to the Future for the 18/19 school year but improving constantly and will include parents. Additional feedback was discussed from an Evening Training Program survey, included adults in our community as well as students. Feedback from surveys shared as handouts. The survey highlighted top three areas of interest for basic introductory skills and short term certifications from students, parents and industry. Duncan will offer evening training programs including health care, manufacturing/welding, will launch short term certification in the Fall at Duncan. These courses will be open to adults and students in the evening. Concerns expressed about adults in courses with minors. Sally offered to speak to that to keep on agenda- after meeting.

Fresno City College will also expand course work in those areas in the evening for both older students and adults. Fresno County event, Breakfast with the Mayor discussed additional companies coming in to the valley increasing the need for employment. Sally confirmed that Fresno Unified was working with City of Fresno to ensure students would have additional opportunities. Question about linked grant money was asked. Kristen clarified that grant funding was for High School facilities with Fresno Unified matching funds. All 10 applications met minimum score however, not all applications were funded. Six of Fresno Unified applications made funding level. The remainder of the applications not funded will move to the next round. Kristen asked coordinators present to share programs funded. Coordinators shared on the programs approved at their high schools.

Elementary Experiences were shared. Kristen described Iain Patterson's work with elementary sites creating STEM lessons and other experiences. Iain was working with teachers to embed STEM into their existing curriculum and standards. This year's summer opportunities for students were reviewed including Water Park application partnership, Sports Science Institute, Teacher Academy, Doctors Academy and CART.

Tara reminded all of the need industry involvement including Summer project planning, Teacher externships, in class participation, work site tours.

### **Sub-Committee Share Out:**

#### **Sarah Pedelty (Industrial Manufacturing and Technology Sub-Committee)**

Sarah of Habitat for Humanity discussed the Wins- Duncan and Edison robotics students advanced to the First Championship global competition in Houston last week. Schools also won state, regional, and Las Vegas competitions. Gratuities included the new partnership with Dale Costa of Hoover and DeWolf and his construction class and Habitat for Humanity. Ikea sent a lot of merchandise that needed assembled so students built items in construction lab- over 60 in last week. This was a WIN-WIN for both student and industry.

Asks and Opportunities included the San Joaquin Valley Manufacturing Summit happening on May 17th. Fresno USD will have a booth with students attend various workshops. Edison invited all to attend and view some of the environmental projects at STEM Expo May 25th.

#### **Stephanie Robinson (Health and Human Services Sub-Committee Chair)**

Stephanie Robinson, Director of Nursing at Fresno City College shared some Wins including Valley Children's Hospital career fair which provided a chance for students to learn about all occupations within VCH and ask questions. Last Sub-Committee meeting had students present projects, coordinators from Edison and Roosevelt shared on a new partnership with residents from UCSF that would work with students next school year. Nick Valenzuela of Sunnyside discussed plans for

Sports Medicine and discussed presenting with students at a panel meeting on CTE for California State Legislation.

Asks and Opportunities included the Collaboration Summit on June 2 at St. Agnes on Opioid crisis. Please attend- flyers on back table to register.

**Tiffany Adams (Agriculture and Natural Resources Sub-Committee)**

Tiffany Adams shared on the Sunnyside showcase last night- 4th year. Great seeing this year's first senior group and how far they've come. 300 students participated. Push presentations at the freshman level so great opportunity for them to practice. Mascot for world ag expo- one of SS students inside it for Kids day ad for Ag day at the Chaffee Zoo. Students at zoo shared their knowledge of agriculture. An additional win was Hoover Eco Tech students will have the opportunity to compete in Chicago in a few weeks at the National Wind Energy Convention creating wind turbine designs as part of the competition.

**Xavier Martinez (Business and Entrepreneurship Sub-Committee)**

Xavier Martinez of Workforce Connection shared on recent Youth Entrepreneurship Academy completion where McLane, Bullard and Roosevelt students competed. Congratulations to McLane student, Jorge Gonzalez Cortes who won 2nd place overall for his party equipment business and would now be going to New York to compete nationally. Gratitude for the last Sub-Committee meeting at Patino where we heard business ideas from students. Thank you to Mark Jackson from Blue Dolphin Engineering for additional donations to YEA.

Asks and Opportunities – Patino needs judges for pitch proposals on May 10, 15, 16. Shared #HackFresno event coming up tomorrow at Fresno State-starts tomorrow. Prizes donated from many sponsors. Xavier stressed that you don't have to be a coder to participate.

**Heather Marquez (Education, Child Development and Public Service Sub-Committee Co-Chair)**

Heather Marquez of Junior Achievement shared Wins including 124 Fresno Unified students trained and hired as paraprofessionals this year. Students get work experience, classroom experience, and teacher preparation workshops. Students also took CBEST recently. Most have now passed the NCLB in Sunnyside's program and get college credit through Careers in Education course. Students have accumulated nearly 1000 hours volunteered this year. Portfolio interview day coming up at Sunnyside. Pat Chacon welcomed committee to come and help review and interview students. Sally Fowler also shared that Pat Chacon was recently honored for outstanding teaching from the Association of Mexican Educators.

Gratitudes included Tina Maldonado sharing about Fresno Police Dept. partnership with Hoover High School- first cohort- teen police academy 11-week program. Each week different officer/dept. member came in to speak to students, did field trips, tours and discussions with dispatcher. Great opportunity to help kids prepare now for what will be needed for their future careers.

Ask and Opportunities – Pat Chacon shared on Sunnyside teacher academy portfolio day May 23rd. Need participants to review portfolios and student presentations. Monorith Arun shared mock interview panelists needed on May 3 at McLane.
