CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM SPOTLIGHTS

ELECTRIC HEAVY TRUCK

Duncan Polytechnical High School

Duncan became the first high school in the nation to receive a fully-functional and fully-electric heavy truck as a training-aid for students.

On October 27th, students in the Medium/Heavy Duty Truck Technology Pathway celebrated alongside Superintendent Bob Nelson and many staff members from Affinity Truck Center, the College and Career Readiness Department, and Duncan Poly as the 2022 Mack HEIL F5000 rolled onto campus for the first time.

Students will now be able to achieve a superior understanding of EV operation and component configurations, which will give them an advantage when they are at their jobsite internships, as well as increase the



likelihood earning certifications for this emerging technology.

Senior Marina Garcia explained what she and many others in her pathway were feeling about the truck by saying, "It's exciting. We're taking a step forward in the community and society."

Students met with some of the clients they will be working with for their technology internships this year. They had a chance to get to know the clients and their business that they will be building websites and social media campaigns for.




BULLARD INTERNS GO TO WORK

CRASH CRIME SCENE AT CART FORENSICS LAB

Center for Advanced Research and Technology (CART)

Forensic Lab teachers Erin Andrade, Jill Rossetti, and Kristine Rubenstein created three crime scenes for student investigation. The three scenes included a car, bike, and victim. Each scene was documented by photographing and sketching and each team used real-world techniques to collect evidence.

Students specialized in specific evidence types and focused on analyzing their specialty. Evidence types included ballistics, shoe prints, tire tracks, and more. Students will analyze their evidence, come up with a conclusion, and then present their findings to the public during a mock trial.



AGRISCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AT THE FAIR

The Agriscience & Technology Pathway had a lot of projects at the Big Fresno Fair!

Agriscience Plant Projects

22 students from the pathway submitted plant projects into the fair. Each student submitted at least 4-5 plant projects for a total of 89 plant projects at the fair! These plants were all cloned by students and have been under the care of these students since school started.

- 67 of the plant projects got 1st place in their class/division!
- 16 of the plant projects got 2nd place in their class/division!
- 2 of the plant projects got 3rd place in their class/division!
